

Dear Fellow BSBCCA Owners and Members,

The odd / even system for sitting / gathering in front of cabanas is still in effect and probably will continue to be in effect for the entire Season.

The purpose of the odd / even system is to allow cabana folks to sit / gather in front of their units without the worry of being in close proximity to the folks of the next cabana. It's all about the need for social distancing driven by the coronavirus. The odd / even system is not meant to be punitive --- it is meant to allow all cabana owners to enjoy the most beautiful beach in New England while minimizing the risk of covid infection. This rule is of vital importance because it is the only way that the six-foot social distancing mandate can be met in front of the cabanas.

If your cabana is even-numbered, you can sit / gather in front of it on even-numbered days. If your cabana is odd-numbered, you can sit / gather in front of it on odd-numbered days.

When it is NOT “your day,” you should treat your cabana as if it were a bathhouse. You should go to the unit and get what you need for the day --- beach chairs, umbrellas, towels, snacks, etc. Then you should go to the beach or some other part of the facility for the day.

If you place some of the items in your unit onto the deck so that you can maneuver around inside the unit to get the items that you need for the day, you must return those items into the cabana before you go to the beach. Again, think of it as a bathhouse. If you were to remove items from a bathhouse and put them in the bathhouse aisle in order to reach other items inside the unit, you would not leave those items in the aisle when you go to the beach. When it is not “your day,” do not leave any items on the deck in front of the cabana. **When it is NOT “your day,” the deck area in front of your cabana must be clear.**

In addition, please remember that **there must be a 42-inch unobstructed path along the railing of the cabana decks around the pool, in the horseshoe, and in the square.** This long-standing rule has taken on greater significance this Season. That clear travel path is needed to allow folks to move along the cabana decks while still social distancing from those who may be sitting in front of the units.

Lastly, please remember that **all personal furniture must be removed from the deck** and stored inside the cabana at the end of your daily visit.

Please remember that failure to comply with these rules could result in a \$300 fine to your unit.
